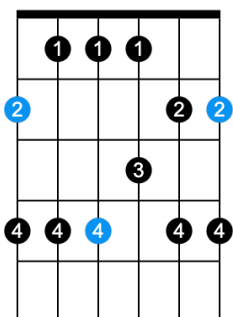


- + There are 5 patterns that make up the Major pentatonic scale on the guitar.
- + The major Pentatonic Scale is made up of 5 notes taken from the major scale.
- + The Notes are numbers - 1 2 3 5 & 6
- + So in the key of A Major for example the notes will be - A B C# E F#

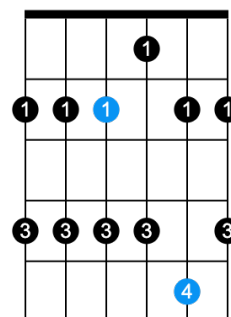
Here are the 5 patterns you need to learn. They are exactly the same patterns as the Minor Pentatonic Scale but the roots have changed. The blue notes are the root notes, so if you start pattern 1 on an A then all the blue notes will be A's.

If you want to be in G Major you need to have your roots or blue notes on G!  
So pattern 1 would start on fret 3 of the 6th string.

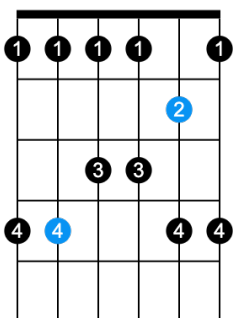

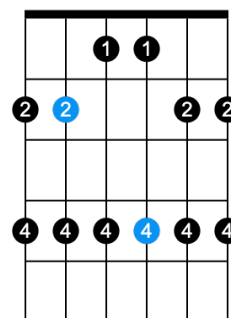
